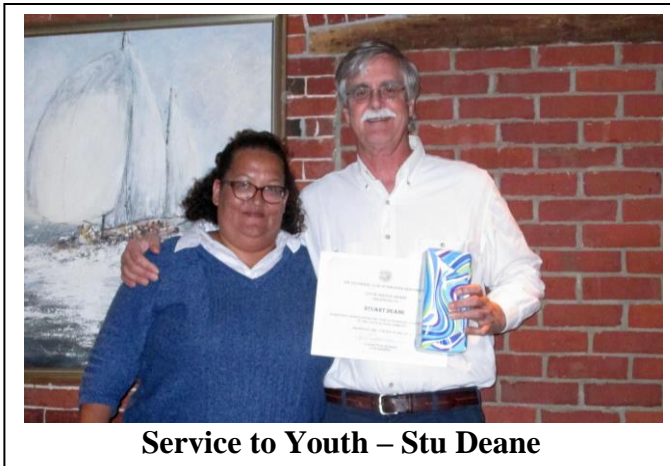
- May 19: Annual Salvation Army Appreciation Dinner, with Tracey Garbers and Stu Deane representing the club.

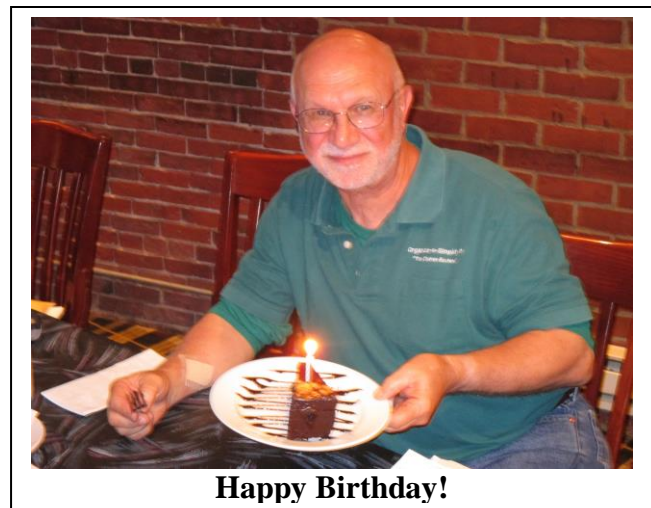

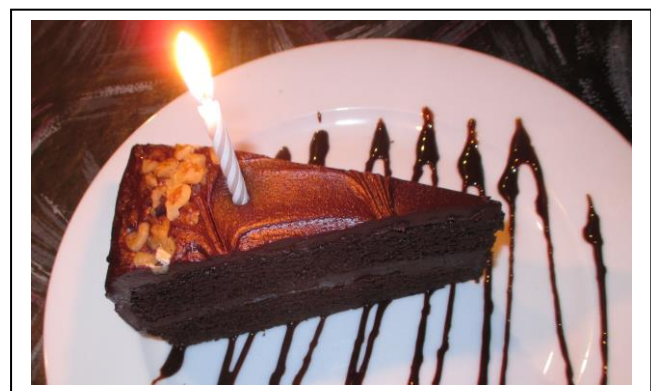

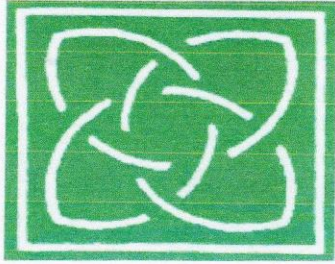
